SYNOPSIS

SELVA is 11 years old and resists growing up.

Her legs are long and unskilled. Her eyes are black, deep and separated. Her curly hair covers her shoulders, burned by the sun. As she goes through an age she doesn't understand, Selva tries to keep her family together, even though this proves to be harder every day.

Her brother has made the decision to leave home; Elena, her only motherly figure disappears after the town's fair; and her grandfather fixates on his imaginary goats while he lets himself die.

As she walks a path of detachment and growth, Selva will help the person she loves the most to die, even though this will mean passing through her last moments of childhood all alone.

"Ceniza Negra" has participated in important Markets and Labs such as 3 Puertos Cine, Bolivia Lab, LoboLab (IFF Mar del Plata), the Film Project Development Workshop Desarrollo by Ibermedia and the Carolina Foundation (Madrid), and Next Step; by Torino Film Lab and Critic's Week of the Festival de Cannes.

It received Ibermedia's Development (2016) and Co-production support (2017), Costa Rica's National Fund (2017) and it won the Industry Prize at the Costa Rica International Film Festival (CRFIC) and at Cartegena de Indias International Film Festival (FICCI).

More recently, it received the Tribeca Latin American Film Fund and the Aide aux cinémas du monde, fund managed by the CNC and the Institut français.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

'Ceniza Negra' is a raw and magical movie. An intimate story that portrays the life of Selva, and addresses the issues of grief, detachment and the end of childhood, building a surrealist vision of death, but deep and true from the sensitive point of view of the protagonist.

Selva is going through the process of letting go of her dead ones, just like me. And thus, we walk together through this land of ashes.

Her story takes place in the coastal towns of the Caribbean of Costa Rica, areas that coexist with migration, uprooting, and territorial uncertainty. 'Ceniza Negra' seeks to rescue this Latin American reality, from a solid artistic vision that immerses us in a playful, powerful and surreal atmosphere.

The visual and sound elements of the film connect us with the inner world of Selva, that ephemeral and particular moment of our life in which the thin line that divides childhood and adulthood is constantly vanishing.

How not to risk, then, to tell a story where imagination and fears coexist, cemeteries and schools intermingle, the living and the dead mix with each other?

Sofía was born 1989. She studied Image and Sound Design at Buenos Aires University.

Her most recent short film "Selva" had it's International Premiere at the Semaine de la Critique of the Cannes Film Festival in 2017. It has screened at festivals such as Melbourne, Gijon, Olhar du Cinema, and Guanajuato where it was awarded the Women in Film and Tv Award, and the Festival Biarritz Amérique Latin where it won the TV5 Award.



She is developing "Land of Ashes" her debut film, set to be shot in Costa Rica in 2018. "Land of Ashes" won industry prizes at Costa Rica's IFF and FICCI (Colombia) and it was supported by Ibermedia and Costa Rica's National Fund. It was selected in scriptwriting labs such as Ibermedia's Project Development Lab and NextStep (Semaine de la Critique + Torino Film Lab).

Mariana Murillo- Production

Mariana specialized in Film Production in Madrid's ECAM.

In 2011 she funded Sputnik Films, Production Company behind "The Sound of Things", film that premiered at the 38th Moscow Film Festival in 2016, and was awarded the Kommersant Weekend Prize. It went on to screen at multiple festivals such as the Festival Biarritz Amérique Latin, the Mar del Plata International Film Festival and the Costa Rica International Film Festival where it was awarded the Special Jury Prize. "The Sound of Things" was Costa Rica's Official Selection for the 2018 Academy Awards.

She's currently developing Ariel Escalante's second feature "Zanfona", selected for EAVE PUENTES 2017. Also, "Land of Ashes", by Sofía Quirós, a project that was selected to participate in 3 Puertos Cine (FIC Valdivia + Distrital + IFF Rotterdam) and LoboLab (Mar del Plata IFF). In 2016 it was granted an Ibermedia Development Aide and won the Project Presentation Forum in CR IFF and the XII International Producer's Meeting at the Cartagena de Indias International Film Festival (FICCI) in 2017. It was granted Costa Rica's National Film Fund and Ibermedia's Co-production fund in 2017.

Her most recent short film "Selva", directed by Sofía Quirós, was premiered at the 56th Semaine de la Critique. It has screened in more than 20 film festivals around the world including Melbourne, FIC Valdivia, IFF Guanajuato (Women in Film and TV Award) and Biarritz (TV5 Award).


Promenade Films, France. Founded in 1996 by Samuel Chauvin and François Lunel to discover new talents in emerging cinematographies.
