ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Director's statement – by Jenni Toivoniemi

A few years ago, many of my younghood friends got divorced and suddenly I was in parties where people behaved like they were teenagers again. Surprisingly many hooked up with the same people they were together with - or wanted to be together with - as teenagers. The denial of aging and longing for carefree youth that never existed in the first place, intrigues me. I believe we all are several different versions of ourselves at the same time and we need nostalgia and regression to visit those former identities.

In my film, a group of old friends is gathered on an island to reconstruct a birthday party for Mitzi, 35, a party as good as the one they had ten years ago. Not everybody, including the birthday girl, wants to even be there. While the jolly festivities are re-enacted the old dramas start to resurface.

I cannot escape my dark sense of humor and aversion towards sentimentality, but I find it's important to make a film that has a gentle, humanistic core. I want my film to feel like a good conversation with an old friend: one where you realize something new about yourself and your past, one that is brutally honest yet comforting. "I see you. You need to get your head out of your ass. You're being stupid. You are wonderful. We are going to be ok. Or die trying."

Jenni Toivoniemi - Director's bio

Jenni Toivoniemi (b. 1978) is a writer-director. Toivoniemi's debut as a director, short comedy *The Date* (2012), won several awards including International Short Fiction Jury Award at the Sundance Film Festival and a Special Mention at the Berlinale Generation 14+ in 2013. She has directed several short films, of which *The Committee* (2016), written and directed together with the Norwegian Gunhild Enger, premiered in Locarno 2016 and *The Door* (2017) was selected to Palm Springs Short Film Festival, Nordisk Panorama and other festivals. Toivoniemi has also written theatre plays, an audio play and a feature film *Korso* (2014) together with **Kirsikka Saari.** Their latest collaboration, children's film *Sihja*, will premiere in 2020. Toivoniemi was also part of the writer-director team of *Force of Habit* (2019). Her first feature film *Games People Play* premieres in 2020.

Venla Hellstedt – Producer

Venla Hellstedt (b. 1973) studied literature and film in London and gained an MSc in Social Anthropology from the London School of Economics and Political Science. In UK, she worked in a number of documentary, drama and news productions for BBC, ITV and the Discovery Channel. Venla returned to work in her native Helsinki in 2009, after nearly 14 years in the UK, and has since worked as a producer of many award-winning Finnish films and international co-productions. Two of the films that she produced have received the national film award for the best documentary. In 2012, the documentary film *Dance of Outlaws* was awarded at Locarno IFF. In 2018, her first feature film production as a producer, *Stupid Young Heart* premiered in Toronto IFF and received the main prize, the Crystal Bear in 2019 Berlinale Generation 14+ competition. She has taken part in several international film professionals' courses, such as EAVE Producers' Workshop and Crossing Borders, and is a member of the EFA.

Elli Toivoniemi – Producer

Elli Toivoniemi (b.1984) is an award-winning producer-director from production company Tuffi Films based in Helsinki, Finland. She has been working as a producer since 2009, and has produced and co-produced films and series in all forms and lengths, including five feature films. Toivoniemi is an EAVE & ACE producer graduate, and is a co-founder-owner of the production company Tuffi Films, and behind acclaimed films like the Academy Award nominated short fiction *Do I Have to Take Care of Everything?* (2014). Films produced by her have been distributed all over the world and awarded at festivals for instance at Sundance (*The Date* 2013) and Chicago (*The Good Son*, 2011), one of the latest productions, *Stupid Young Heart* (2018) is Berlinale Crystal Bear Winner and Finland's official Oscar Entry 2019. The newest project she is behind is anthology series *Force Of Habit*, exploring how women are discriminated against because of their gender in public and private life. This all-female production covers 11 episodes and a single feature film by fifteen writers and directors, including herself.

Jarmo Kiuru – Director of Photography

Jarmo Kiuru (b. 1985) has been working as a cinematographer since 2009. He has gathered experience from working in both fiction and documentary films, television series, music videos and commercials. Internationally he has worked in Estonia, Sweden and Lithuania. His films have been awarded in such film festivals as Sundance and Berlinale and competed in Cannes, Toronto and Clermond-Ferrand. Jarmo was nominated for Golden tadpole in Camerimage (2013).

Samu Heikkilä – Film Editor

Samu Heikkilä (b. 1971) is one of Finland's most respected film editors. Since early 2000's he has worked with many highly-acclaimed Finnish directors, including Aki Kaurismäki, Zaida Bergroth, Aleksi Salmenperä, Aku Louhimies, Klaus Härö and Selma Vilhunen. During his career, he has edited a total of over twenty feature films and ten documentaries. He is known for his devotion to each project, and is sometimes co-credited for sound design and screenplay. Heikkilä is frequently nominated for Finnish Jussi awards, and he's received the award for editing six times.
