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SYNOPSIS

One year after suffering a horrible traffic accident, Geni is ready to resume her life... or at least that's what her family wants to see.

The truth is that despite trying to please everyone, Geni feels unable to live up to expectations: her life before the accident no longer interests her. Why resume it then?

The confusion that this creates causes her behaviour to become increasingly more erratic and leads to a single idea that begins to grow within her: escape.

With an amazing ability to direct actors and magnificent camera work –invisible, but always in the right place at the right time–, Mar stands out for her true-to-life view of our society and knows how to magically reveal the small secrets behind which universal emotions hide.

DIRECTOR'S BIOFILMOGRAPHY

Mar Coll was born in Barcelona in 1981. At 18 she started studying at the film school ESCAC (Escola Superior de Cinema i Audiovisuals de Catalunya), from which she graduated with a degree in film direction. For her final year project she made the short film *LA ÚLTIMA POLAROID*, which was selected at an array of Spanish and international festivals and earned several awards, including third prize in the prestigious 'Versión española' television award.

Her first feature film, *TRES DIES AMB LA FAMÍLIA*, won the Goya for Best New Director, the Silver Biznaga for Best Director, Best Actress and Best Actor at the Malaga Film Festival, the Navaja de Buñuel Award for the Surprise Film of the Year, and the Gaudí Awards for Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actress.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When we started writing TODOS QUEREMOS LO MEJOR PARA ELLA, we thought of it as a drama, with some touches of black humour, but a drama nonetheless.

We started with the story of a couple of acquaintances who had suffered an injury and we tried to imagine the horrible process of trying to rebuild their personality like someone who tries to assemble the pieces of a broken vase.

With the only map being the image of you emitted by a life around you determined for nothing to change, because it would have difficulty coping with a strange or indefinable loss: the reassembled vase can never be exactly the same.

Geni is thus born as a character doomed to fail.

Maybe I can relate in part to her effort to live up to the expectations she generates. Just like I can relate to her clumsiness. Who's never dreamed that upon arriving at school they discover in despair that they're wearing,

slippers? Geni feels kind of like that, like she's wandering through the world with the wrong shoes: no matter how hard she tries, there's always something that eventually betrays her.

As we were shaping the film with the idea of turning this starting point into something more hopeful, we realised that it was precisely this natural inability to fully conform to convention, not because of ideology but because of incomprehension, which held the character's authenticity and purity. Something that, to some extent, places her above those who expect something else from her. Paradoxically, Geni's erratic behaviour is what ends up questioning the values and ways of the world around her.

Thus, 'poor Geni' slowly becomes a character who is geni-al in her confusion, fun, impulsive, empathic, tender and, at times, even clairvoyant.

The result is that the drama we started off with has become a more eclectic film that, while containing a harsh look at our world, has succumbed to the energetic force of its main character, thus becoming freer, fresher and more conciliatory as the film unravels. And the truth is that I feel much more comfortable with it.

ESCÁNDALO FILMS

ESCÁNDALO FILMS was founded in 1995 with the aim to find and promote new talent in Spanish film-making.

Over the last twelve years, they have consolidated their reputation by producing almost 200 short films with more than 500 national and international awards (including Sundance Film Festival, Oscars Student Academy Awards, Méliès d'Argent, Festival de Mar de Plata, and the SGAE Spanish Version Award).

Given the success achieved by our productions, ESCÁNDALO FILMS has established itself as an R+D factory for audiovisual products, and has created a strong foundation for supporting productions which encourage the introduction of young creative talent into the audiovisual industry.

THE "ÓPERA PRIMA" PROJECT

OPERA PRIMA is a strategic project of Escándalo Films that started in 2006. It was set up to promote the introduction of new writing and technical talents to cinematography. Three years after it was started it is bearing its first fruit.

The widespread acclaim by the public and critics (Cannes, Locarno, Rotterdam, Toulouse, Valladolid, Stuttgart, Malaga, Miami, Chicago, London, Premios Goya, Premis Gaudí, etc.) of feature films of the ÓPERA PRIMA project has positioned Escándalo Films as a producer of new talent.

A meticulous action plan and the work with new upcoming talent in Catalan filmmaking have resulted in the national and international projection of a unique innovative project. The catapult effect intended by ÓPERA PRIMA is working.
